## What needs disruption

The status quo:

- 2 decades of gains in literacy wiped out due to the pandemic
- 63% children estimated to become learning poor
- 584 million children below the minimum proficiency level in reading
- 24 million additionally to dropout and add to an existing pool of 258 million out-of-school children
- 781 million adults are illiterate
- 2 out of 3 adults who are illiterate are women

171 million people could be lifted out of poverty if all students in low-income countries could read. World Poverty could be cut by half if all adults completed secondary education
